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Executive Summary

This report outlines findings from Alternative Education data collected during the Community Action Youth and Drugs (CAYAD) West Auckland Youth Alcohol and Other Drug (AoD) Experiences Survey conducted from May – June 2015. The survey was the quantitative part of a larger study that resulted in the production of the Knowing Someone Cares report.

The purpose of this project was to identify the current situation and gather deeper insights into at-risk young people's AoD experiences and associated harms in West Auckland. Through this, we aimed to further the understanding of the experiences and needs of at-risk young people who use alcohol or other drugs, especially within the Alternative Education setting.

This project focused on at-risk young people, as they have a higher probability of experiencing harm from alcohol or other drugs and there was a gap in quantitative and qualitative data available on their use of alcohol and other drugs. Young people were engaged through mental health and AoD support services, teen parent units, key government agencies and alternative education providers.

The survey investigated the following:

- Nature of respondents' home life
- Drinking behaviour
- Alcohol-related harm
- Family drinking
- Alcohol and drug education
- Other drug consumption
- Access to alcohol and other drugs



At-risk young people have been defined as young people with a low connection to education; who are engaged with key government agencies such as Police, Child, Youth and Family (CYF), or Ministry of Justice (MoJ); and/or who are engaged in AoD or mental health support services.

The survey questions were developed with Auckland Council's Research, Evaluation and Monitoring Unit, with input from specialist subject matter experts to ensure appropriate, youth friendly wording. Ethics approval was gained from Auckland Council's Human Participant's Ethics Committee for the qualitative part of the project which involved empathetic conversations with 21 young people aged 14-24.

Community Action Youth and Drugs (CAYAD) is a national initiative established to reduce harm to young people and families/whanau from AoD. The Ministry of Health funds CAYAD sites in cities, towns and rural areas across New Zealand with outcomes aimed at:

- Increasing informed community discussion and debate about issues related to AoD
- Ensuring effective policies and practices to reduce alcohol and other drug related harm are adopted
- Increasing local capacity to support young people in education, employment and recreation
- Reducing supply of AoD to young people

Findings Summary

166 young people were surveyed and the following summary of statistics provides an overview of the results collected from the 85 Alternative Education students who took part.

Drinking behaviour

- 92% had first drink at 15 or younger and almost 50% at 11 or younger
- 20% drink daily or almost daily and 32% drink weekly
- 62% would have 5 or more drinks on one occasion
- 55% would have 5 or more drinks at least once a week with 15% drinking 5 or more drinks daily or almost daily
- 22% don't plan when they will stop, 27% plan to stop at swaying/memory loss or falling over/vomiting stages and 5 % plan to stop at falling over vomiting
- 26% reported actually stopping drinking at the falling over vomiting stage
- 63% drink premixes (Cody's etc) and do so because they taste good and get them drunk faster
- 42% said they often or sometimes acted or pretended to be more drunk than they were
- The young people reported mostly drinking to have fun with friends, to get drunk, to celebrate or to unwind relax

Alcohol-related harm

- Almost 70% have had an alcohol related black out; 87% had their first alcohol black out at 14 or under
- Almost 50% said that they or someone they know had been injured or hurt because of their own drinking
- 18% said they had been affected by their parents drinking
- 51% have driven drunk and 63% have been a passenger with a drunk driver
- 31% have had unsafe sex when intoxicated, however 28% preferred not to answer this
 question.
- 18% have had an unwanted sexual experience, however 20% preferred not to say

Alcohol and other drug education and help

- 35% said they didn't find any of the drug and alcohol education they had received helpful and 27% said information on health and body effects was helpful
- 51% said they didn't know what would encourage them to ask for AoD help if they needed it.

 23% didn't know what would help them decrease their drinking; 27% said that nothing would help them decrease their drinking and 23% said more activities/other things to do would get them to drink less.

Other drug consumption

- 65% had consumed cannabis and 14% preferred not to say
- 51% had consumed synthetics and 11% preferred not to say
- 30% had consumed hallucinogens and 11% preferred not to say
- 21% had consumed inhalants and 14% preferred not to say
- 18% had consumed ecstasy or party pills and 13% preferred not to say
- 10% had consumed meth and 16% preferred not to say
- 29% had consumed non prescribed prescription drugs and 16% preferred not to say
- 46% reported consuming drugs and alcohol at the same time

Access to alcohol and other drugs

- Aside from asking a stranger to buy alcohol for them, the young people reported mostly getting alcohol from an older sibling, relative, parents or older boyfriend/girlfriend
- 40% thought people in their community got cannabis mainly from dealers, growers, sellers or tinni houses; with 11% from friends, relatives or neighbours
- 21% thought people in their community got synthetics mainly from dealers or the black market

Comparison data

Comparisons were made between the data collected from the Alt Ed students and other atrisk West Auckland young people of the same age (under 17 years old). This comparison showed some but not dramatic, differences between the two groups. Comparisons between this data and the Youth2000 research studies of mainstream education students' alcohol and other drug use is being investigated.

The West Alternative Education students were more likely to:

- be male and Māori (67% of WAE students vs 44% of non-AE)
- be male (60% vs. 48%)
- have grown up with large families with five or more siblings (52% vs 27% of non-AE) or small families with no other siblings (16% vs 8% of non-AE) and slightly more likely to have grown up with a single parent/caregiver (40% vs 32% of non-AE)

- have started drinking at a young age, to drink frequently and be motivated to drink to get drunk.
- have had their first alcohol-related blackout aged 14 or younger (86% vs 57% of non-AE) and slightly more likely to have had their first drink at age 11 or younger (43% vs 30% of non-AE).
- to drink daily or almost daily (20% vs 9% of non-AE)
- plan to drink until swaying / memory loss (22% vs 7% of non-AE) and less likely to plan to drink until relaxed / social (20% vs 26% of non-AE)
- have driven drunk
- have had their first alcohol-related blackout younger than age 14
- report drinking in public places (51% vs 28% of non-AE).
- report drinking the type of alcohol they do because it gets them drunk faster (53% vs 29% of non-AE) and slightly more likely to drink premixes (63% vs 52% of non-AE)
- have driven drunk (51% vs 26% of non-AE)
- state that nothing would encourage them and their friends to drink less (27% vs 10% of non-AE) and less likely to be responsive to decreasing drinking in response to serious consequences or harms (12% vs 41% of non-AE). Money however, does appear to be a higher motivator for WAE students (15% vs 7% of non-AE)
- not know what would encourage them to seek help if they needed (51% vs 29% of non-AE)
- have consumed synthetics (51% vs 33% of non-AE), hallucinogens (30% vs 18% of non-AE), inhalants (21% vs 8% of non-AE), non-prescribed prescription drugs (29% vs 10% of non-AE), and other drugs (6% vs 0% of non-AE)
- rate asking strangers to buy alcohol (48% vs 37% of non-AE) and less likely to rate family and friends as an important source of alcohol


Both groups of students were roughly equally likely to report having used cannabis, ecstasy or party pills, and amphetamines, although in all cases a larger percentage of WAE students reported preferring not to say.


Age What age group are you in?







How many siblings do you have?











Planned intoxication level before stopping drinking












How often have you been unable to remember what happened the night before after drinking?

If you have been unable to remember what happened the night before after drinking alcohol, what age were you when this first happened?






How often have you been a passenger in a car driven by someone under the influence of alcohol?


Have you had unsafe sex when under the influence of alcohol?


















Have you ever consumed hallucinogens?




Have you ever consumed ecstasy or party pills?


Have you ever consumed Amphetamines - meth, P or Ice?








